


Introduction to Arboriculture: Planting and Early Care

CD1011 *Planting and Early Care* contains two major sections: planting and early care. Each lesson is superbly illustrated with color photos and diagrams, and there is onscreen text and narration for each illustration.

The objectives of planting are

1. Learn the techniques and procedures used to plant trees.
2. Understand how using proper techniques can improve survival and accelerate establishment.
3. Be familiar with the various types of nursery stock.
4. Understand that each stock has its advantages, limitations, and proper planting techniques.



The objectives of early care are

1. Understand the special requirements of newly transplanted trees and become familiar with early-care procedures.
2. Understand the nutrient requirements of newly planted trees and learn which types of fertilizers are acceptable and which could be potentially detrimental to an establishing tree.
3. Understand the benefits associated with proper mulching techniques.
4. Learn the techniques used for, as well as the advantages and disadvantages of, staking or guying newly planted trees.
5. Learn how to prune a newly planted tree and how to train a young tree to develop a strong branch structure.
6. Become familiar with which information should be included when writing or accepting written planting specifications.

Crop Sciences Laboratory Manual

X900 *Crop Sciences Laboratory Manual* is a new publication written by Patricia Stoller, Department of Crop Sciences, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.


In 234 pages, this manual provides an introduction to Midwestern crop sciences. It is appropriate for community college or university crop sciences classes. High school agriculture instructors may find the manual useful for supplementing their class laboratory activities.

There are color illustrations and color photographs throughout the manual. Each of the 14 chapters has a notes-taking section at the end of the chapter, and there is a multipage laboratory exercise for each chapter.


Weed Identification CD-ROM

[MDS707a Weed Identification Digital Slide Sets](#) is a PowerPoint CD-ROM for weed identification. It includes all the weeds on the IAVAT weed identification list (these are the same photographs as in the official slide set used in the IAVAT Crops Career Development Event). Presentations include 1) the regular set with images and text descriptions of the weeds 2) a practice set without weed names appearing by the images, and 3) a new third set that is an interactive quizzing presentation which allows the user to choose an image to answer a question. In all, there are more than 360 frames on this CD, plus a useful readme file, a facsimile of the weed ID card [J999.108](#), and a 16-page study guide. *KMc*



Weed Identification Quiz Pack CD-ROMs

This quiz pack contains 1) weed identification practice sets without weed names appearing by the images and 2) interactive quizzing presentations which allows the user to choose an image to answer a weed identification question. These same files are on [MDS707a Weed Identification](#), but we've made the quiz packs so instructors can hand out a quiz CD-ROM to each student and send them to a computer at school or send them home to do some drill-and-practice to learn weed identification. *Weed Identification Quiz Pack* (item [MDS707a-10](#)) is sold as a set of 10 identical CDs. *KMc*

The 2006 State Crops CDE will be Saturday, December 9. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m. at the Stock Pavilion on Pennsylvania Avenue at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. Group leaders will lead their groups to Turner Hall immediately following the 9:45 announcements at the Stock Pavilion. Refer to the *Crops Career Development Event Rules* and *General Development Event Rules* and *General Rules* for more information. Scantron score sheets will be used. Participants will need to bring a clipboard and a couple of pencils for filling in the Scantron sheets. The following references will help prepare a team:

MDS707a *Weed Identification Digital Slide Sets* is composed in Microsoft PowerPoint and should run equally well on PCs or Macs. It includes all the weeds on the IAVAT weed identification list.

MDS707a-10 is the *Weed Identification Digital Slide Sets Quiz Pack*. Useful for student drill and practice at school or at home.

U4073 *The Weed Factor* is an 8-page publication that discusses how weeds and their seeds impact agriculture. Lists primary noxious, secondary noxious, and common weeds that are likely to occur in corn, soybeans, wheat, and oats in Illinois.

J790 *Crop Judging* is a judging manual that describes judging wheat, soybeans, corn, oats, silage, and hay.

Z7003 *Crop Seed Samples* is an identification set which includes 34 crop seeds. These are the crop seeds on the IAVAT Crops Career Development Event crop seed identification card.

Z7004 *Weed Seed Samples* is an identification set which includes the majority of weeds listed on the IAVAT Crops Career Development Event weed identification card.

F791c and **S791c** *Weed Identification* are filmstrips and slide sets (respectively) which illustrate all the weeds on the Illinois Crops Career Development Event weed identification list. Each frame has common name, one to three photographs per weed, and frame numbers. Each filmstrip or slide set comes with a study guide containing descriptive text.

F791c(Supp) and **S791c(Supp)** *Weed Identification Practice Set* are filmstrips and slide sets (respectively) which are designed for practice and testing. These sets start with a listing of weeds and frame numbers, as stamped on the slide mountings, to serve as a key for the set. Weed photos have no associated weed names or frame numbers. THE S791c(Supp) SET IS USED IN THE STATE CROPS CDE FOR THE WEED IDENTIFICATION CLASS. *KMc*

EZ Records — Renewing your Subscriptions

It is time to start thinking about renewing subscriptions to *EZ Records*. When an *EZ Records* subscription gets close to the end of the subscription period a message will appear on the login window. This message is a reminder that the end of the subscription period is approaching. Users should acquire another access code for the renewal process. Access codes are available at ITCS Instructional Materials, contact ITCS at (800) 345-6087, FAX (217) 333-3917, or mail an order to ACES Information Technology and Communication Services, 1917 S. Wright St., Champaign, IL 61820.

EZ Records subscription renewals will be limited to just a few weeks prior to the end of the subscription period. Acquire a new (unused) access code prior to renewing an *EZ Records* subscription. Users will be prompted to enter and validate the new access code. *DW*

EZ Records Tips

EZ Records data is stored in a server located in the College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences and is very secure. Each individual account is only as secure as the password the user selects. To avoid someone other than the user gaining access to an account the password should not be shared with other people.

An accepted practice for generating the monthly totals for Wage/Labor Summary requires users to total the entries on page 5A, B, or C (Record of Experiences). When totaling the monthly entries, the totals may become difficult to identify as they mix with the daily entries. To make the monthly totals easier to identify insert 10 asterisk symbols in front of the Monthly total entry followed by 10 more asterisk symbols (*****November totals*****) then place the totals in the appropriate column.

If a calculator is needed while computing totals, evaluation factors or some other value users should not forget that a calculator is available on the computer. The calculator may be started and minimized when not in use. You can use calculator to perform any of the standard operations for which you would normally use a handheld calculator. Calculator performs basic arithmetic, such as addition and subtraction, as well as functions found on a scientific calculator, such as logarithms and factorials. If you have difficulty locating the calculator on a computer, use the [Search](#) function from the start menu. Creating a shortcut on the desktop may be beneficial when using the calculator. *DW*

EZ Records FCAE Subsidy

The FCAE project is providing a subsidy to reduce the user price of *EZ Records* for Illinois schools to \$3.00 per subscription. Schools continue to order *EZ Records* using the traditional methods, and *EZ Records* access codes sent to teacher via e-mail. The price will continue to appear as \$6.00 in the catalog but for each Illinois high school ordering *EZ Records* the price charged will be \$3.00. Do not order *EZ Records* access codes from the web using a credit card. If you wish to order *EZ Records* and purchase them with a credit card please call (800) 345-6087.

Do not order quantities larger than your school needs as FCAE has a limited budget for this project. The *EZ Records* project is planned for next year so teachers do not need to "stock-up" on access codes. *DW*

EZ Records Teacher View Accounts



ITCS will provide complimentary *EZ Records* Teacher View access codes to teachers. When a school orders *EZ Records* a Teacher View access code with a few directions is e-mailed to the teacher. If a teacher/school receives *EZ Records* access codes from another source such as from the IAVAT Professional Development Committee a request must be made to receive a teacher view access code.

The teacher view account provides access to *EZ Records* student record books electronically. Teachers have the opportunity to make comments on each record book page and may score each page as part of a grading schedule. The grades may be changed at the discretion of the teacher at any time during the grading period. The software also tabulates a total score for each enterprise, core record pages, and creates a grand total score which is converted to a percentage of the total possible. A scoring and comment summary is available and may be printed to provide a hard copy. DW

EZ Records — Enterprise Name Changing

One of the features of the Web based record book is the opportunity to extract state data. Previous generations of students had the option to name their record book enterprises what ever name they wished; we would like to start a name change that includes a little more information. For example, a student that has an enterprise named heifers may not provide as much information to determine if the **heifers** are Beef or Dairy, another example is a crop enterprise named **Wilson farm** but does not indicate that crop is being grown.

Our recommended naming sequence includes entering the names such as Beef – Steers, Beef – Show calves, Beef – Feeder cattle, Dairy – Heifers, Dairy – Cows, Corn – Wilson farm, Soybeans – Wise farm, Soybeans – Miles farm. The agribusiness category may also contain vague enterprise names, including a more complete names specific to the enterprise will be beneficial in the future. Students should avoid naming an enterprise with a proficiency award area title; the enterprise name should be more specific. An example might include an enterprise name such as Floriculture when the student is actually employed at the Old English Hedge florists. A better name may include the name of the floral shop. A student mowing lawns would not name the enterprise Turf Management but rather a name that might include more specific information, 'Blue Ribbon Lawn Care'. DW

Receiving Record Book Access Codes

We have discovered that some teachers order *EZ Records* access codes and do not receive their access codes. *EZ Records* access codes are sent to teachers via e-mail. If you do not receive your access codes in a timely period be sure to contact us and we will determine a method so you receive your access codes. Our e-mail list may contain an error or some teachers place filters that block or send the messages to junk mail, such as the automatically generated message containing *EZ Records* access codes.

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
